FROM CANON MARK GILBERT

Dear Friends

As we commemorate the anniversary of D-Day this June, it's important to reflect on the monumental significance of this historic event and the role that Petworth played in it. Petworth Park was home to three camps with a total capacity of over 3,500 men and several hundred vehicles. Based at Petworth were the 27th Armoured Brigade, who were specially trained for beach operations. Among their equipment was the highly secret amphibious D-Day Sherman Tank, a marvel of engineering designed to propel ashore when launched from a vessel.

In addition, Goodwood House was utilized by the 6th, 23rd, and 121st General Hospitals Royal Army Medical Corps in the run-up to D-Day. Their preparations were crucial, as they readied themselves to care for the high number of expected casualties. This included packing tents to be erected as temporary hospitals on the continent.

Reflecting on D-Day and its tremendous cost, we recall the words of Jesus: 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends' (John 15:12-13). Jesus spoke these words as he prepared his disciples for his own imminent sacrifice, offering his life for the healing of the world. During the Last Supper, he shared bread and wine, symbolizing his body broken and his blood shed in love for all. He instructed his followers to 'do this in remembrance of me' until the kingdom comes in its fullness.

At our 80th Anniversary service we will honour the sacrifice of those who participated in D-Day. The scale of the operation was immense, and those who took part were acutely aware of the risks they faced - the possibility of sacrificing their own lives or sustaining serious injuries. This was a necessity, as regrettable as it was, to bring about peace and freedom.

As we remember the costs of war, we are called to heed Christ's commandment to love one another as he loves us. This call to love and peace extends to all humanity. Let us honour the memory of those who laid down their lives by striving to embody this love in our own lives, fostering a world where peace and freedom can flourish particularly in this present climate.

ST BARTOLOMEW'S CHURCH, EGDEAN Annual Parish Meeting Report

Fr Mark welcomed eleven people to the Annual Parish Meeting on 2nd May. Jenny Walker and Roger Dallyn were re-elected as Churchwardens and Fr Mark thanked them for all they do. He also said he was so pleased that Roger and Christine Dallyn were given the Order of St Richard's Award last year in recognition of all their work for the parish.

Mr Charles Bray was re-elected as Treasurer and Mrs Christine Dallyn was re-elected as Secretary, Fr Mark thanked them both for all their work.

The Treasurer circulated the Audited Financial Statement for Year Ending 31st December, went through the breakdown of 2023 income and expenses figures and commented that although the planned giving had increased, total receipts were down on the previous year mainly due to the appeal for the ceiling works together with grants received for the repair.

Total income amounted to £18,100 and outgoings of £26,975, giving a deficit of £8,875 the main difference is the additional expenses of £9,070 for the east elevation roof repairs due to water ingress. Overall the accounts remain in good order at the end of the year with monetary assets and investments amounting to £65,240. Robin Walker was re-elected as Auditor.

Roger Dallyn briefly went through the Churchwardens' Report and thanked everyone for their support during the year, he also thanked all the regular readers. There have been 49 services with a total of 839 people attending, 25 were children. We also had two funerals and one ashes internment. At the end of the year we had a Quinquennial Inspection by our architect, Richard Andrews, which included a summary of recommendations of items requiring attention.

Christine reported that the Electoral Roll has been revised and the numbers have remained the same as last year at 54.

Fr Mark reported that it had been a very good year with new people from Byworth attending, including a young family. The Coronation Event was a fantastic evening as well as being a very successful fund raiser. Also the Barbecue was another good get-together evening. It was a shame that the Harvest Supper had to be cancelled and he hoped we would be able to hold one this year as it is such a lovely venue and community event. He thanked everyone for their help and support.

Those that attended the Lent Book evening commented how much they appreciated and enjoyed the evening.

WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

To those not involved in Council work on West Sussex and indeed the South-downs National Park Authority there is not a great deal that the Councillor can tell you about this month. So much of the work is done with an individual, who has a specific problem, or items that arise but of no interest to our towns and villages here.

A lot of County work involves the whole of the area but there are overall County issues that involve everyone. I do try and keep you informed especially through your Parish/Town Council or by meeting up at events like Lunch Clubs and Coffee Mornings.

I am afraid the old timescale of 21 days from when potholes prove to be deep enough and have the white line around them has now gone out of the window. The dreadful weather we have had since last October has made an enormous increase in our highways work load. Not only potholes, but slipped banks, fallen trees and blocked drains. We are gradually getting around to do the work but it's a slow process. When in the rural areas our marvellous Patching machines can be used, they do a great job and can cover large areas at a time. We now have 3 of these machines but not sure we can get more. Unfortunately, they can't be used much in the urban areas but in rural areas they are great.

Fostering is an on-going concern. Despite our fostering recruitment and retention being the strongest it has been for 10 years the number of young people we care for has also increased and continues to grow, over 900 at the time of writing. If you know of anyone who is interested in looking into fostering please check the website. There are ample training opportunities and how wonderful to be able to help some who have had a difficult time so far in their lives. It is of course a commitment, and like all commitments has its up and downs, but what a great thing to do.

Swifts by Michael Blencowe for Sussex Wildlife Trust

These are uncertain times. Who knows where this planet is heading? But since the start of May I've been looking to the sky for a sign of reassurance: the return of the Sussex Swifts from Africa. Ted Hughes expressed it perfectly: 'They've made it again / Which means the globe's still working, the Creation's / Still waking refreshed, our summer's / Still all to come.

Swifts may not look like much - they're basically two wings and a mouth - but it's hard to explain their abilities without making them sound supernatural.

Swifts are all about flying. They feed, scream, and mate in the air and bathe in the rainclouds. At night they switch off half their brain, switch on cruise control and fall asleep amongst the stars. If they had their way they would never come down. But there's one little flaw in their plan: eggs don't float. So, for just a few weeks of the year, they begrudgingly swap the open skies for a cramped nest under the eaves where they raise their young. The problem is in recent years



most of these little gaps have been lost to renovations and modern architecture. The destruction of their homes is one of the reasons why Swift numbers have fallen. They are refugees on the wind.



They cruised into Sussex in May after a non-stop, long-haul flight from Africa; not that this trip bothered them. Swifts are all about flying. For me, the Swift is the only bird that takes pure, unadulterated pleasure in flying. Other birds fly out of necessity, but Swifts seem to fly for the joy of it, screaming with delight at the top of their little Swift lungs, a shrill cry that is forever associated with English summers. By the time you read

this, a new generation of Sussex Swifts, born in a roof cavity, have crawled to the nest entrance, and bravely launched themselves on their first flights.

. And what a first flight - they may not land again for two or three years! For these 'teenage' Swifts, the skies of Europe and Africa will be their playground. Nothing will tame them. Well, not until they meet a partner and decide to settle down in a roof of their own somewhere. But don't let this comfortable image of domestic bliss fool you - there's no taming these Wild Ones.

FAMILY SUPPORT WORK

FSW has been a hive of activity in the last month. Many of our practitioners have been running group sessions for their clients to support them in parenting issues as well as their normal day-to-day home visits. These groups are a really valuable way for parents to learn new skills when faced with challenging behaviour from their children, and have been a great success. We are also still receiving a large number of new referrals which we are trying to accept as quickly as we can, although waiting lists are still in place in most areas.

We were able to close a particular family in Newhaven recently, after supporting them since October. This is a relatively quick turnaround, as usually the challenges facing our families take much longer to resolve successfully. After the final meeting the parent sent this message to her practitioner.

'Having you to talk to has been invaluable. You have helped me make sense of things when I felt too muddled. You have given me tools to help work out my thoughts and feelings and know how to manage them better. You have helped me understand my options and given me space to talk about worries. I feel so much better now and I know I can come back in the future if I need to'.

Receiving this sort of feedback really gives us a boost when times can be very challenging, so it was wonderful to see the impact that we have had on this parent's life over the last 6 months.

Our fundraising and events schedule continues to be very busy, although unfortunately our skydive at the end of April was cancelled because of poor weather. This has been rescheduled for 24th May so hopefully there will not be any weather-related problems next time. We will be at the South of England Show again from June 7th - 9th so if you are planning on attending the Show, please do come and find us opposite the Norfolk Pavilion.

Our foodbank is currently running very low on lots of items so we would appreciate your support with any donations (see the attached flyer for specific details).






