

In its spacious marquee, the Petworth Park Antiques & Fine Art Fair has around 60 exhibitors, predominantly members of The British Antique Dealers' Association and LAPADA The Association of Art & Antiques Dealers. They offer for sale a wide range of desirable items from furniture, jewellery, sculpture, glass, lighting, photography, vintage watches and silver to paintings, drawings, ceramics, clocks, 20th century design objects, maps, prints, oriental carpets, tribal art, historical medals, aeronautica, garden ornaments and many other decorative and unique works of art spanning the centuries.

We are very happy to again work with The National Trust at Petworth House as well as with the local dealer association PAADA and the Petworth Business Association, creating yet another exciting event. The grand 17th century house boasts an internationally important art collection, and together with its 'Capability' Brown landscaped country park, it provides a magnificent backdrop for our annual fair.

The fair has its own free car park by the marquee - access is from the A272 Tillington Road through the gate at New Lodges. The AA signs will direct traffic to this entrance and not to the main car park on the A283, where there is a charge of £4 for non-National Trust members. Disabled parking close to the fair entrance. The pedestrian entrance is via the Cricket Lodge gate, also on the A272, or via the Cowyard.

WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

I think we can all agree that the dry March was certainly made up for in April. Let us hope that we have some good gardening weather in May and beyond.

As you will now know the A29 at Pulborough was opened on 18th April, with concrete boulders lining the road, to single line traffic with lights at either end. These will be monitored to control the traffic flow.

On top of that to our west we have the terrible fire at the Angel Inn in Midhurst. Because of safety and the stability of what is left of the Hotel the A286 has to be kept closed to through traffic. However, it's business as usual for most of the other shops and restaurants, etc. in the town. The knock-on effect of this is that traffic is having to get around Midhurst, the small back roads are taking a real hammering and although County is trying to patch when some get really bad it is not an easy job.

Our Childrens Services have now had OFSTED in, at the moment of writing I do not have the results but I am hopeful that we are doing well.

Another development I have mentioned before, Woodlands Mead School which is for special needs children near East Grinstead is also nearing completion and will take some 500 pupils when finished.

Finally, I hope everyone has an enjoyable time in their Parish for the Coronation. We have been working hard in Petworth to make sure that there is something for everyone to remember.

I sincerely hope we all see better times and weather with the coming of late Spring and Summer.

MIDHURST ROTHER COLLEGE

Celebrating Students and the Tradition of Gilbert Hannam Day

On Thursday 23rd March, Gilbert Hannam Day, the College continued the tradition of celebrating community education and outstanding achievements of students. The day marks the continuity of education in Midhurst, of which Gilbert Hannam was an integral part, and comprises a traditional church service at St Mary Magdalene and St Denys, Midhurst for our Year 11 and Year 13 students, with an awards ceremony being conducted during the evening.

Gilbert Hannam

As a young man in his teens and a member of a Parliamentary company engaged in the Civil War, Hannam fought his way eastwards across England. For a considerable time Hannam's troop was stationed near Petersfield, and he frequently delivered messages to parliamentary forces in the Midhurst area. Edward Hannam, his uncle, had a prosperous woollen business in Midhurst and Steyning and young Hannam joined him after the war as a weaver and coverlet maker.

In 1672, believing strongly in the importance of education, Gilbert Hannam set up a free school for twelve poor Protestant boys in a classroom in the loft of the Market House. Later, the school was moved to Gilbert Hannam's old house in North Street.

Gilbert Hannam died on St, Patrick's Day, 17th March 1677. In his Will, he asked that each year, on the anniversary of his death, a service be held in the parish church at which his scholars would pray for his soul. During the service a man in orders would preach a sermon, the fee for which was to be twenty shillings and a pair of gloves to the value of two shillings and sixpence.

This special church service continues the tradition of prayers for the soul of Gilbert Hannam, the sermon and the gift of gloves. This year current Head Boy and Head Girl, Jacob Thompson and Lily Crawford presented the traditional gift of a pair of leather gloves to Reverend Jane Roberts.

The congregation enjoyed a rendition of Beethoven's 'Allegretto' and 'The Final Countdown', performed by Midhurst Rother College Orchestra.

In the evening students were invited, along with their families, to celebrate their achievements in the College Theatre. Prizes were presented by the Guest of Honour Miss Chloe Dudman, ex Head Girl of Midhurst Rother College. The evening also sees students and alumni receive endowments from the trustees of the Gilbert Hannam Education Foundation who continue this long history of stewardship.

The students, staff and Governors of Midhurst Rother College would also like to thank the Gilbert Hannam Education Foundation for their continued support and particularly for their sponsorship of Gilbert Hannam Day. We would also like to express our appreciation to Reverend Jane Roberts and all the staff and volunteers at St Mary Magdalene and St Denys, Midhurst.

Nightingale by Michael Blencowe of the Sussex Wildlife Trust

My bottom desk drawer is a graveyard, the final resting place for the obsolete. A broken calculator, foreign coins, buttons and a Maxell C90 cassette given to me a few years ago. I had no means of playing it until I recently discovered my clunky cassette deck hiding in the garage.

An accompanying note says the tape contains 'the song of a Nightingale in the churchyard of St John sub Castro, Lewes, spring 1985'. It was recorded by a lady called Barbara from an upstairs window in neighbouring Lancaster Street. After some dusting, re-wiring, buzzing and hissing the sweet sound that swirled from my speakers transported me back over three decades to



a time when Reagan negotiated with Thatcher, Paul Hardcastle's na-na-na-Nineteen topped the charts and a Nightingale sang in St John sub Castro.

To be frank, Nightingales aren't much to look at. Small brown birds; a Robin without the redbreast. But when they open their beak there's a Susan Boyle-like transformation. These drab birds become the world's most celebrated vocalists. For centuries, poets have praised their performance. Homer, Shakespeare, Coleridge, Wordsworth, Clare, Keats, Dylan and Cohen. Shelley claimed, 'A poet is a Nightingale who sits in darkness, and sings to cheer its own solitude with sweet sounds'. Trust young Percy Bysshe to believe the bird was wallowing in its own self-pity. The Nightingale's song is actually both an aggressive war-cry and a sweet, structured sonnet. A hymn to the silence in the hope of enticing a passing female.



The Nightingale's optimistic warbles have inspired everyone from the late Vera Lynn to Roxy Music. A BBC recording of a bird singing in Oxted in 1942 inadvertently captured the roar of Lancasters, Wellingtons, Stirlings and Halifaxes passing overhead laden with bombs destined for Germany. The contrast between innocence and beauty, terror and destruction make it the most powerful sound I have ever heard.

Nightingales will sing by day but are most famous for never letting up when the sun sets, their beautiful phrasing carrying loud and clear over the muffled grunts and hoots of other nocturnal animals. Once the Nightingale has hooked a partner his nocturnal performances will stop, so there's a narrow window to hear them. Our Nightingales spend the winter south of the Sahara in a wide belt between Senegal and Kenya, usually returning in late April.



Due to habitat destruction the UK population of this amazing bird - so entwined in our cultural heritage - is in a steep decline. The sound of a Nightingale singing in the centre of Lewes may have been relegated to the bottom drawer of history but we are blessed to still have this bird performing in our Sussex woodlands. We must never let their song of hope be silenced forever.

LUCIEN FREUD ART AND THE MAN By JOHN IDDON

John is a Lecturer and Guide at both Tate Britain and Tate Modern. He ran an MA course in Heritage Interpretation at St Mary's University College and has lectured freelance to numerous art societies, to the National Trust and the Peggy Guggenheim Gallery in Venice.

Possibly the greatest figure painter of the second half of the 20th century, Lucian Freud also led an extraordinary life, from his family's escape from the Hitler regime in the 1930s to his colourful and combative life in London. This talk will look at his unforgettable paintings (many of which have a penetrative scrutiny that is almost the visual equivalent of his grandfather Sigmund's analysis of patients) as well as his relations with his models and fellow artists.

For those families we are supporting, we have been running lots of Easter holiday activities to keep children entertained, including trips to Aldingbourne Country Centre, cinema and bowling, Arundel Castle cricket and various messy play and craft sessions. These have all been supported brilliantly by volunteers, so thank you to everybody who has supported any of these events. We are also looking forward to our first Dalesdown residential weekend in the middle of April, where many exciting activities are planned including archery! Thank you to everybody who kindly donated Easter eggs for our families these were very gratefully received and much enjoyed by all.

For anybody living in the Littlehampton, Uckfield and Heathfield areas please be aware that we are currently in the running for support from the Tesco blue token scheme (until 30 June). NEWS FOR MAY

On Saturday 1st April our Petworth Food Bank organised a 'Race Against Hunger' event, with either a walk or a run of three miles in Petworth Park. Over 30 of us, plus some dogs and two prams set off from the URC (United Reformed Church) to walk in Petworth Park. We had a party atmosphere as the sun was shining and the Park was looking like Spring.

As we entered by the Cricket Lodge gate, three or four set off on a run. Their prize? To be first back to grab an ice cream! Indeed, after an hour's friendly walk, we all returned safely to find an ice cream van waiting to serve us. A lovely occasion.

Our generous walkers raised over £380 for the Food Bank.

Next day, on Sunday 2nd April, our annual **Palm Sunday Procession** took place in Petworth, starting at the Sacred Heart Church in Angel Street at 3.00 pm. After Father Peter Newsam encouraged us to transport ourselves back 2000 years onto the streets of Jerusalem, we moved off. At the head of the Procession, was the Cross, followed by two donkeys, our PACT banner, the Town Band, and up to 100 followers as 'the crowd'. We waved palms and sang three hymns, including *Ride On, Ride On in Majesty*. At each stop, we had a short Reading from the Gospels about Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, followed by a Prayer.

Walking up Lombard Street to St Mary's Parish Church, it was quite a special experience when the hymn singing reverberated around the buildings.

It is a small but important statement to make to the Petworth community that Christianity is still alive!







LIVES REMEMBERED


With the passing of **MARK TARVER** both the church and wider community have lost a faithful and loyal supporter.
