


A SUCCESSFUL ANSWER TO AN UNUSUAL ENQUIRY!

I took a telephone call from someone, whose brother now lives in the Orkneys. His brother had become very interested in the memorial to the sinking of HMS Royal Oak by enemy action on 14th October 1939. 835 out of the ship's complement of 1,234 men and boys died as a result. Furthermore, their now deceased father had recalled that someone from St Mary's, the sexton perhaps, was one of the fatalities. I found the following article in the December 1939 edition of this Parish Magazine.

In Memoriam.

THE REV. JAMES DOUGLAS CREE, R.N.


After leaving Felsted School, "Jimmy" Cree (as we usually called him) spent some time in Canada, and whilst there, heard the call to the Ministry, and returning home, entered King's College, London, to prepare for his ordination. His first curacy was at S. Margaret's, Plumstead, and he was ordained Deacon in 1930 and Priest the following year.

He came to Sussex at the end of 1933 as Curate of Petworth, and his special interest in the boys and young men of the Parish, turned his thoughts to the Royal Navy. After serving in the *Iron Duke* he went out East in the *Suffolk*, and spent some years in a China station. Shortly before the outbreak of war he became Chaplain to the *Royal Oak*, and here he gave his life, with many of those to whom he had ministered, when his ship was sunk by enemy action.

Always genial and approachable, he had a great capacity for making friends and for keeping them. In his work as a Naval Chaplain he found great happiness and he will be greatly missed.—R.I.P.



Petworth Area Churches Together working together in harmony

NEWS FOR SEPTEMBER

During the Summer holidays, the PACT Food Bank has made a regular monthly food box (or boxes) delivery to 44 families - approximately 80 boxes per month. These provide meals for all those children who normally have free School lunches.

This is a mammoth task for our team - not just delivering, but collecting the sorted food from Chichester (up to a quarter of a ton of it per week), and also packing the boxes. As usual our volunteers have responded magnificently.

They have delivered to addresses in Petworth, as well as several villages round and about.

In July, four students and a teacher from Seaford College came and gave the premises - in the basement of the United Reformed Church (URC) in Petworth - a thorough Spring clean. They worked extremely hard, scrubbing, moving boxes and cleaning out dark corners. They were so helpful. Later on, they helped fill some boxes with food items.

We continue to be most grateful for the food donations received in the basket by the door at the Co-op in Petworth.

Founded in 2006, Chichester Chamber Concerts has for the last fourteen years been bringing world-class artists and ensembles to the Assembly Room in Chichester's Council House for the pleasure of the music-lovers of Chichester and surrounding area.

Every month from October to March you can hear musicians who travel the world playing in the great concert halls of Vienna, New York, Berlin, Paris and London.

This year the season opens with the appearance of our new President, pianist Simon Crawford-Phillips with distinguished violist Lawrence Power; they are long-time friends and duo partners. The season continues with a concert by the Heath Quartet who played in Chichester to great acclaim in February 2019. Their programme will include Schubert's much-loved Death and the Maiden Quartet. In December we will enjoy the young Hungarian pianist Zoltán Fejérvári. Fejérvári was booked to play for us in December 2020 but was prevented by the Pandemic, since then he has given a highly acclaimed Wigmore Hall recital. The season continues in January with the appearance of the exciting new Kaleidoscope Chamber Collective, directed by pianist Tom Poster. They will present a stimulating programme of works for wind instruments, violin and piano. In February and March we have been able to rebook two programmes which were also prevented by Covid 19 in 2021: the brilliant young Armida Quartet from Berlin, and the Arcadia Quartet with pianist Katya Apekisheva.

I know how upset residents are and many have now formed volunteer Speed Watch groups. The Police are hard pushed to be out on the roads at the times we know are the worst for these problems and I am afraid this will not be easily solved. In the meantime, I've been successful in working with Highways and getting some of worst country roads mended and improved. I am hopeful that, although you will still find potholes, the roads have improved.

Budgets: It's that time of the year again when we at County, District and the South Downs National Park are working on our 2023/24 budgets. It's not going to be easy, but our books must balance and we are already having member workshops to see if, as ever, things can be done differently. We have some Statutory duties and these we must do, but there are many things that both CDC and County do that are not Statutory, but appreciated in our communities. We will always see if they can be continued even if done differently. That's better than losing a Service that residents appreciate.

Great Tit by Michael Blencowe of the Sussex Wildlife Trust

Just for the record; I've never trusted them. Unlike all the other familiar, friendly faces on my back garden bird table there's just something about the Great Tit

that's always made me suspicious. Perhaps it's my mistrust of uniforms. The Great Tit's smart plumage with a collar, black tie and a glossy black cap makes them look too official, too authoritative. And that bright yellow chest? Far too garish for the garden.

Their behaviour isn't exactly endearing either. Great Tits are the bullies on the bird table. They'll aggressively assert their authority and



violently peck at other birds as they plunder the peanuts. When a house-hunting Great Tit can't find a suitable hole to nest in, it'll simply evict a Blue Tit and move in.

Their dominance is also heard in spring when their two-note song, 'Tea-cher! Tea-cher! Tea-cher!' rings out through our woodlands. It was this 'Tea-cher!' that taught me my first lesson in bird song identification; an easily recognisable two-note war cry used to proclaim the tit's territory. But I was soon to learn that not everything was how it seemed. Each male actually has an average of four different songs, which can be sung at three different tempos. This varied repertoire is a sly Beau Geste trick employed to trick other Great Tits into thinking that a woodland is more crowded than it really is. The birds who know the most tunes secure larger territories and breed more successfully. And it's a trick that fools me each year too; if I don't recognise a bird call in the woods it's always a Great Tit.

Through aggression and deceit, these birds have successfully established an empire that spreads from England to China. And it's from the far-flung corners of this empire that we've recently received reports of some rather worrying behaviour. From Finland came news of a group of Great Tits changing their vegan diet of seeds and nuts to something much more meaty: other birds. In Hungary, scientists made the chilling discovery of a population of Great Tits which have developed a taste for the brains of hibernating bats. Sure, these are isolated incidents at the moment but with human society plunging rapidly towards the abyss and an army of Great Tits acquiring a taste for blood and brains, is it unreasonable to hypothesise a post-apocalyptic future where humans are at the mercy of plagues of zombie Great Tits? Close your windows people – they're coming for us!







He sadly passed away on 25th July at the age of 61 years.


It was his wish that his funeral arrangements remained private.
