

PEGGY BURRELL

Tribute by Michael Taylor



Good afternoon, on behalf of the family I'd like to thank everybody for the many phone calls, letters, cards and flowers that have been received.

Thank you all for coming to celebrate the life of Margaret or Peggy Bruce Burrell.

David's Wife and Best Friend for over 47 years, Mother, Grand Mother, Stepmother and Aged Aunt who had a major impact on all of our lives.

An amazing lady, a great cook and host.

I'd like to share a little about her life with you all because it was adventure filled, spanning many countries, hobbies, friends and family....

Something that some of you might not be aware of was where Mum was born. William and Edna Bakewell announced Peggy's arrival in Srinagar a Northern Indian City in Kashmir in the foothills of the Himalayan mountains on the 26th June 1936. Mum's father William, a retired Army Captain, worked for the Indian Forestry Commission and was responsible for designing, building and maintaining roads. During her early life the family moved with her father as projects and responsibilities changed. Mums first mode of transport was a pony!

In 1946, after the second World War, Peggy and her mother travelled by ship to Tilbury and she was sent to the Elmhurst Ballet School in Camberley where she made many lifelong friends.

Life was very challenging due to the distances involved. Mums holidays were in England without her parents. The first year she stayed with a family in Hinton St Georges, Somerset. After that her holidays were spent with Pat Smythe and her mother in Gloucestershire (Pat was to become an Olympic Show Jumper later in her life). This was where Mum developed a passion for horses and riding.

After 3 years she left Elmhurst as she'd decided that she wasn't going to become a ballerina! She moved on to Byculla School in Hampshire and then onto a Secretarial college in Bridport in Dorset.

At this time Mums father was working in Calcutta, this provided the opportunity for her mother to come over to the UK more regularly to spend time with her. When she returned to Calcutta, she worked in the administration team for the Deputy High Commissioners Office.

Mums love of horses led her to become Champion Lady Rider riding FACTO-TUM on the flat at the Tollygunge Club in Calcutta.

This is also where Mum met my father who was a Sales Manager at Dunlop in Calcutta, they were married in London in 1957, my sister Pippa and I carried on the family tradition, both also being born in India, in Calcutta.

The family moved back to England in 1962 and then moved to Copenhagen in 1964 for 2 years and, on our return to the UK, spent a year in Colchester and moved into the family home at Weybridge, Surrey. We were lucky to have a largish garden and Mum enjoyed pottering around in the garden with a pair of secateurs. As a result of her work our garden always looked amazing despite the presence of Simba our Golden Labrador.

Mum married David in 1976 and they have been joined at the hip ever since!

After their wedding they lived together for 5 years in Brunico in the Dolomite Mountains in Northern Italy. Life changed for us as we struggled to learn or understand Italian and skiing! To the frustration of the locals as the ski lifts stopped more regularly when most of us fell off! In the summers this meant wet feet and amazing BBQs on various riverbanks across Italy.

On their frequent trips back to the UK Mum and David made a point of catching up with all 4 children, Alex, Richard, Pippa and myself. On their return from Italy Mum and David moved to Henley-on-Thames with Mum working as a receptionist in the Doctors Surgery and then at the Henley Royal Regatta Headquarters by the river.

Their summer holidays were spent at Puerto Pollensa, Majorca enjoying long lunches, and hosting drinks and dinner parties with friends.

After 5 years they moved up to Bridgnorth, Shropshire in 1986 when David became a Director of Laystall Engineering in Wolverhampton. Mum and David integrated with the community and Mum became involved with the NSPCC including a year as their Chairman.

When David retired in 2001 they moved down to Petworth to be close to Alex and Pippa. This is where another of mums great passions began to emerge. Something that some of you may not be aware of is that Mum blossomed as a painter and created an amazing number of oil paintings which adorn the walls of their home in Petworth. She continued to flex her green fingers at every opportunity and looked after their beautiful garden.

More recently their Summer Holidays were spent in Dartmouth with a relaxed lifestyle, great food and the opportunity to walk everywhere.

Mum and David threw themselves in to Petworth Village life and have made many special friends.

Mum was on the Nuts & Bolts Committee of the Petworth Music Festival and was a member of the Friends of the Petworth Cottage Nursing Home, to name just two. With David acting as the handyman creating the staging and mum added amazing flower arrangements at numerous flower festivals.

Mum loved flower arranging and supported this church for many years, Daisies being her favourite flower.


A number of the congregation today will remember Mum for her love of cooking, whether that was large quantities of Gluten Free Bread in my case, or amazing birthday cakes for the family or friends including Caterpillar cakes before M&S took over.

Not forgetting very special lunches, little nibbles including her renowned Chicken Liver Pate and dinners. She was also known for her Father Christmas and Mr Snowman meringues.

A Mum, a Grannie, and a friend, Peggy meant a great deal to a great number of people and cared for many more. She was a woman of many amazing talents and lived a most amazing life. She cared deeply for all of you and this lovely village, and she would be so grateful that you have come here today.

We will all miss her dearly.

We look forward to hearing your stories and raising a glass to her after this service at the Angel.

Chichester Chamber Concerts Season 2023 - 2024

Founded in 2006, Chichester Chamber Concerts has for the last seventeen years been bringing world-class artists and ensembles to the Assembly Room in Chichester's Council House for the pleasure of the music-lovers of Chichester and surrounding area.

Every month from October to March you can hear musicians who travel the world playing in the great concert halls of Vienna, New York, Berlin, Paris and London.

The season opens with a return performance by the Castalian Quartet who gave us such pleasure with their concert in 2018. This is followed by a young French violinist Charlotte Salouste-Bridoux from the Young Classical Artists Trust with pianist Joseph Havlat who played for us at our AGM last year. In December we will have the great pleasure of a concert by the Sitkovetsky Trio who were prevented by the Pandemic from coming in 2020. In the New Year we will welcome a young brass ensemble: Connaught Brass. They have been earning great praise for their performances. In February we will hear the young Dutch Dudok Quartet playing Mozart, Beethoven and a new work by Polish composer Grazina Bacewicz. Finally, in March we will have a treat: a Mendelssohn programme from the English Chamber Orchestra String Ensemble - led by violinist Ofer Falk. This will include the violin concerto in E minor and the Octet.

INTRODUCING THE '98 FLEX'

Your flexible new way to travel by bus around the north of Petworth

Getting around the north of Petworth by bus is now easier with the launch of a new service called the '98 Flex', which is the latest service to launch as under the County Council's new 'Book-a-Bus' service initiative.

'Book-a-Bus' is a demand responsive bus service, which will serve the more rural areas in the county that currently have limited or no traditional bus services available. This new service operates within set zones and offers passengers pick-up in locations close to them and travel to their destination all for the same price as a standard bus fare. Fares are currently capped at £2 per trip until 31st October 2023, and thereafter £2.50 until 30th November 2024.

The new north of Petworth 'Book-a-Bus' is the second zone to be introduced. The '98 Flex' is a fully flexible service with no conventional timetable or routes, operating based on the bookings it receives via the 'Ride Pingo' app or by phone. The service covers the rural area to the north of Petworth, with travel restricted to starting and ending within the same zone. Drop-off points with onward connections to travel by bus or train are also included within the service zone to ensure ease of onward travel.

The new service has been made possible by a partnership between the County Council and Community Transport Sussex (CTS), the community transport operator who is providing the new service for this zone. CTS will deliver the service and use it as a springboard to increase the delivery of more community transport in the area.

Councillor Joy Dennis, Cabinet Member for Highways and Transport, said: 'The '98 Flex' operates in an area that is new to us and serves those living to the north of Petworth, ensuring that travel to key destinations and onward connections are more accessible. At present there are two fully flexible vehicles operating in this zone. Our team is closely monitoring the new service to ensure it delivers what our residents need. The service is on a six-month trial'.

The new north of Petworth service will run flexibly between 7.00 am and 7.00 pm, Monday to Saturday, excluding Bank Holidays. To use 'Book-a-Bus', residents need to download the 'Ride Pingo' app or call our call centre on **01243 858854**. Operating hours are from 6.30 am to 7.30 pm. 'Book-a-Bus' cannot be pre-booked. Up to 5 seats can be booked per trip, subject to availability.



One of my favourite quotes from The Simpsons comes from Springfield's vet: 'I love animals. I spend my life saving them and they can't thank me. Well, the parrots can.' No animals are more famed for their ability to talk than parrots. Sure, their 'talking' is more mimicry than witty after-dinner conversation - a feathered echo chamber - but whether they're chanting 'pieces of eight' on a pirate's shoulder or swearing in front of Auntie Ethel, we humans have been entertained by their backchat for centuries.



There are around 400 species of parrot on our planet. Their native range encompasses pretty much every-

where south of the Tropic of Cancer. For us Brits their beautiful plumage embodies the exotic; the mystery and excitement of faraway lands. So, imagine my surprise when I first saw a big green parrot flying around in Sussex.

The Rose-ringed (or Ring-necked) Parakeet looks ridiculously out of place amongst our comparatively drab Starlings, Wood Pigeons and Crows. With its garish green plumage and red beak, it stands out like a clown who has gate-crashed a funeral. And with that squawk - that incessant, demented squawk - there's no ignoring it.



South-east England's Parakeets are among the world's most northerly parrot populations but how did they get here? Some believe they made their great escape from an East London film studio in 1951, after starring alongside Bogart and Hepburn in 'The African Queen'. Others claim that the Parakeets were set 'Stone Free' by Jimi Hendrix, who liberated them from their plastic cage in his girlfriend's London flat. I rather like the idea of American sixties icons being responsible for the spread of non-native species across the UK. Perhaps Sonny and Cher smuggled Grey Squirrels in through customs under their furry waistcoats, or a tousle-haired Bob Dylan secretly released some American Mink out of the stage door of the Albert Hall in '66.

The truth is, with tens of thousands of Parakeets being imported into the UK it was no surprise that a few slipped their chains and flew the coop. Since the end of the sixties these free spirits have been recreating the Summer of Love across the capital. Forming feral colonies, the Parakeets have filled the air with their joyous, intolerable screeching and squawking; sounds that would make Hendrix and Dylan proud. And as for free love, their blatant fornicating in London's parks has led to a Parakeet population explosion. They were once established in the (sub)urban jungle of Brighton and lived in the trees of Hollingbury from 1977 until the mid-nineties. Surely, it's only a matter of time before the Roseringed Parakeet moves into suburban Sussex.

The summer holidays saw hundreds of children and their parents join us for activity sessions across Sussex, including our annual visit to Warnham Park. SOUTH DOWNS NATIONAL PARK

I don't often talk much about my position on the South Downs National Park Authority so I thought as many of my Parishes have part or all of their Parish inside the Park I would say a little of what has been happening. This year has seen a big turnover of members, not just because of the local elections, but by additional appointments by the Secretary of State.

The biggest part of my input is taken up with Planning and one of the interesting Planning decisions we make is the Boomtown Music Festival which, for those who don't know, is just before you get to Winchester in the deep valley past Cheesefoot viewing Car Park. It is like a natural amphitheatre and this Festival now attracts well over 60,000 people with a staff of some 6,000. I was privileged to attend the first day with other members of the SDNP Planning Committee. It was an eye opener for those who have never been to a Music Festival such as Glastonbury. Whatever you personally think of these Music Festivals it gives a large number of people a huge amount of pleasure which I for one cannot criticise. We have to give planning permission for this Festival so it was good to see it in action and how the whole set up is organised. Lots of happy people.

I also sit on an arms-length part of the SDNP called the South Downs National Park Trust. We are a smallish committee with some excellent Officers and we are at arms-length from the SDNP, but raise money for projects to improve the principals that the Park has, such as improvements to the environment and access for all to the Park. With this in mind we are gradually getting stiles replaced with gates so that buggies, wheelchairs, etc. can access those areas of the Park and this work will continue. We have raised funds to reinstate the Dew Ponds and, although at the moment we are working mainly in the east end of the Park, we have restored two with more in the pipe line.

One more word on this and that is to say that there is much going on and it really is worth taking a look at our web pages. You may be surprised. Of course, like all local authorities we have to run with tight budgets but I think we achieve a great deal, especially when you see the work we have done in places like the Severn Sisters Country Park. Now that really is worth a visit, but you'll need the day to do it justice.

That is of course a small part of what we do and it would take pages to give you all the details, most of which you can find on the web pages of the South Downs National Park.



We remember with thanksgiving the lives of the recently departed.

PEGGY BURRELL, along with David, were faithful members of the St Mary's community and there was deep sense of sadness when news of Peggy's passing became known.

Apart from regular attendance on Sundays, Peggy was an accomplished flower arranger mainly attending to arrangements around the Book of Remembrance which she took great pride in doing.

The couple moved to their Angel Street home some 22 years ago and had both become familiar figures in the parish.

She passed away at the Cottage Nursing Home on 17th July at the age of 87 years.

The funeral service was held at St Mary's on 15th August and was followed by Cremation.

KEN TEMPLE, who passed away on 21st July, will be remembered by many for the successful building business that he ran. Born in 1936, Ken had practically lived all of his life in Petworth. On leaving school he started work at Tillington for Bryders and, after 8 years, he and Stan Madgwick went into partnership as Madgwick & Temple. Later on they decided to part company and Ken set up his separate business at Dene Dip, part of the Pitshill Estate, at Tillington. With son Mark joining the firm it became KJ Temple & Sons.

He and Margaret had lived at Hampers Green for some 60 years before moving to Pagham at the end of 2021.

The committal service was held at Worthing Crematorium on 10th August.
